## Growth Group Questions

1. Define the term legacy. What kind of legacy do you want to leave your children, grandchildren, friends, those who know you? When God takes you home what do you want to be known for?
2. READ Psalm 127:1-2 – Making the Lord the focus of what happens in your home (i.e. values, behavior, and ethics) is essential to living a life that is fruitful and meaningful. Share some anecdotal evidence for the positive benefits of making the Lord the focus of what happens in a home.
3. READ Psalm 127:3-5 – How are children like arrows in the hands of a warrior. What is that metaphor all about? Do you have any anecdotal observations about the behavior of children who were not raised in homes where the Lord was not the focus or foundation of the home?
4. READ Psalm 128:1-6 – What strategies have you thought of or used that allowed you to pass along your values to your children or your grandchildren? How much intentionality is required to make this happen? What does Solomon mean when he says blessing and prosperity will be yours if you walk in his ways (vss. 1-2)?
5. In your opinion what negative influences today on families in America, in our churches? What would you prescribe to help counter the negative influences on our families? What are you personally doing to counter the negative influences in your own family?
6. What would you say is the greatest obstacle Christian families are facing today?
